Distant history, close up

The Museu d'Història de Catalunya takes you on a journey through history that starts in prehistoric times and continues up to the present day. From time to time, the MHC stages temporary exhibitions that supplement the basic content. It also offers you a wide range of complementary services, ranging from a shop, restaurant and library to personalised attention for teachers and guided visits. All with the aim of bringing you closer to a history that goes back a long way: the history of Catalonia, of Escornalbou, in Riudecanyes, and the house of canons of Vilabertran, Vilabertran.

The museum outside the museum

To get to know more about Catalonia's history and culture, let us suggest a visit to some of the historic buildings the museum looks after: the Royal Monastery of Santes Creus, in Aiguamúrcia; the convent of Sant Bartomeu de Bellpuig, in Bellpuig; Cardona castle, in Cardona; the Prat de la Riba House/Museum, in Castellterçol; the Seu Vella (Old Cathedral), in Lleida; Miravet castle, in Miravet; Rafael Casanova's house, in Moià; the charterhouse of Escaladei, in Morera del Montsant; Claramunt castle, in Pobla de Claramunt; the monastery of Sant Pere de Rodes, in Port de la Selva; the Manresana tower, in Prats de Rei; the castle and monastery of Escornalbou, in Riudecanyes, and the house of canons of Vilabertran, Vilabertran.

Auditorium: Hall for lectures, meetings, courses, seminars, congresses and presentations.

Library: Bibliographic and documentary material connected with the history of Catalonia is available for consultation.

Open to the public from Monday to Friday 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. as well as from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays.

Shop and bookshop: Books and gifts. The opening hours are the same as those of the museum and it is freely accessible from the street.

Visits: Visits with specialised guides, for groups of adults and school students every day the museum is open to the public.

Cafeteria and restaurant: With unrestricted access on the 4th floor. Provides a café/bar service during museum opening hours and a restaurant service, with a set menu at lunchtime and an à la carte menu in the evening. There are splendid views over the city from the terrace.
